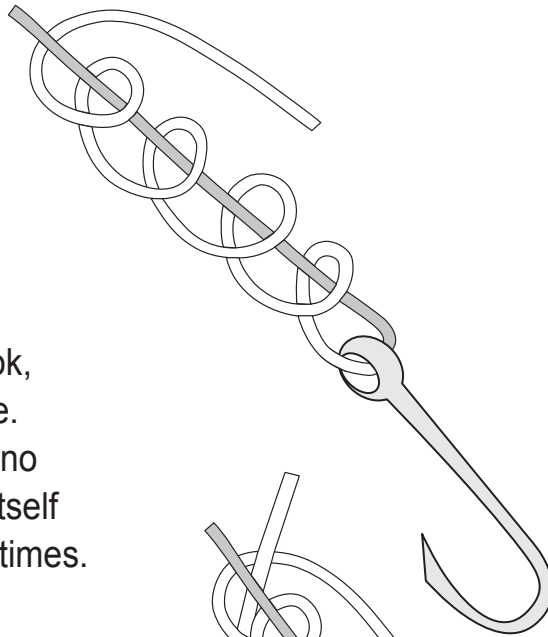


HOW TO TIE KNOTS

how to tie a locked half blood knot.

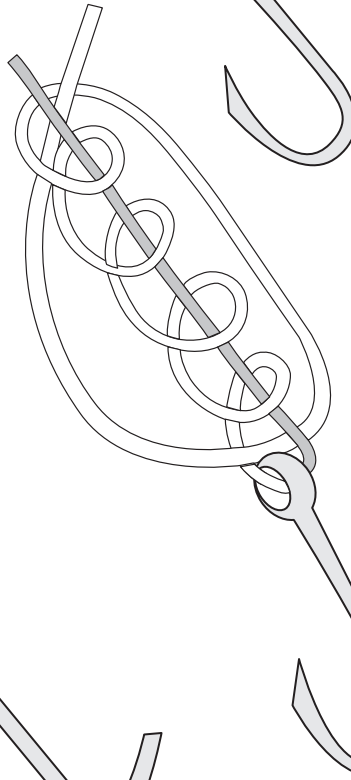
Step 1:

Pass Mono line through eyelet of hook, swivel or lure. Loop the mono line around itself at least four times.



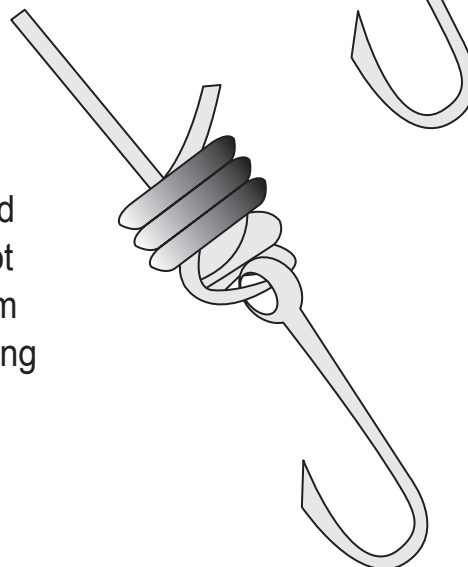
Step 2:

Pass the end of the mono line back through the first and last loops.



Step 3:

Moisten mono line and pull tight ensuring knot ends up at eyelet. Trim off excess mono leaving 10mm approx.



HOW TO TIE KNOTS

how to tie a dropper loop

Forms a loop anywhere on the line without cutting the line.

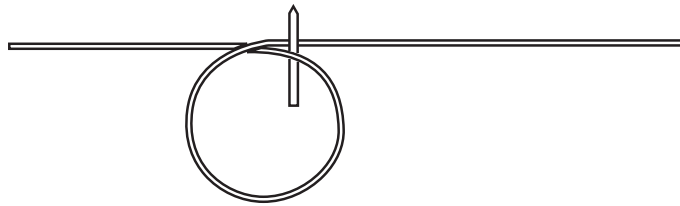
Handy for “easy change” attachment of hooks & sinkers. Traces can be attached also.

step 1



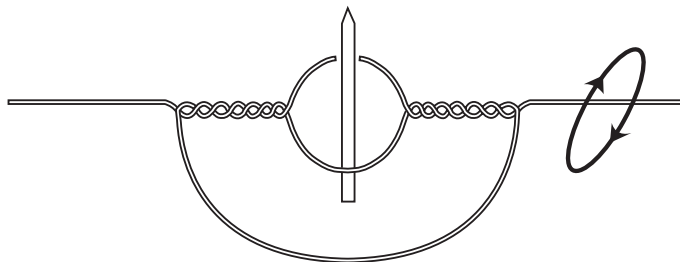
step 2

Form loop & insert short pencil.



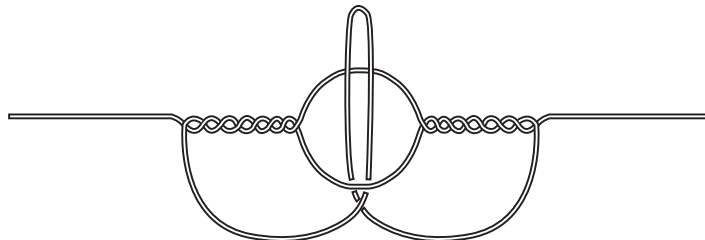
step 3

Rotate pencil to form at least 7 twist loops either side of pencil

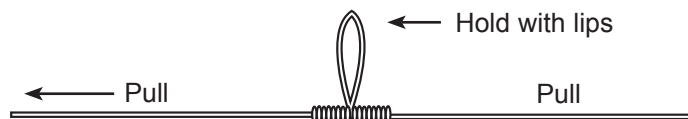

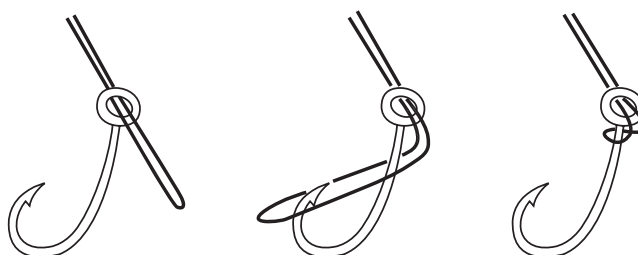
Remove pencil and push dropper through loop left by pencil

HOW TO TIE KNOTS

how to tie a drop loop

Handy for “easy change” attachment of sinkers & hooks to bottom of mainline.

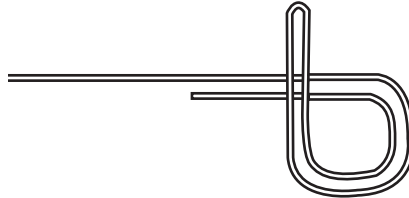

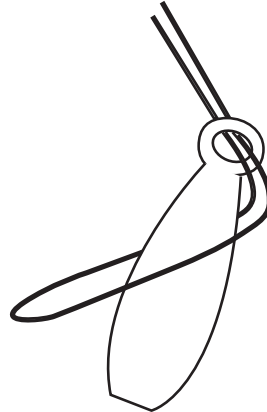
step 1

Run drop loop through eyelet of sinker or hook



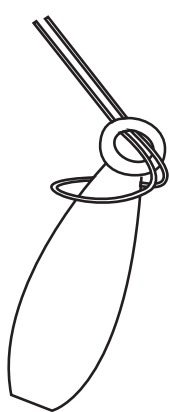
step 2

Spread drop loop and push sinker or hook through centre of loop.



step 3

Position loop in final resting place near eyelet

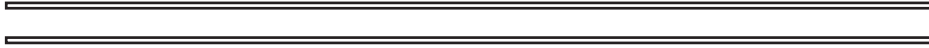


HOW TO TIE KNOTS

How to tie a blood knot

Used for joining lines of similar diameter

step 1



step 2



step 3

Twist left hand side around mainline 5 times and bring line back to starting point and through as shown.



step 4

Repeat as per step 3 on right hand side.



step 5

Moisten knot and pull knot tight with a gentle pulling action on either side of the line. Trim off excess line.



How to tie a surgeons loop

Good for attaching traces to dropper loops along mainline.

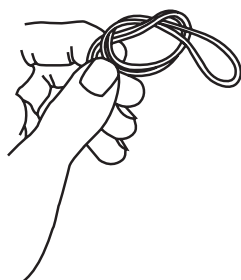
step 1

Double up end of line.



step 2

Tie a simple knot.



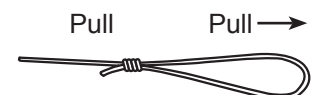
step 3

Run end of loop back under and over though initial knot as shown.



step 4

Grasp the loop and mainline & pull in opposite directions to fasten knot. Trim loose end.



HOW TO TIE KNOTS

How to tie a perfection loop

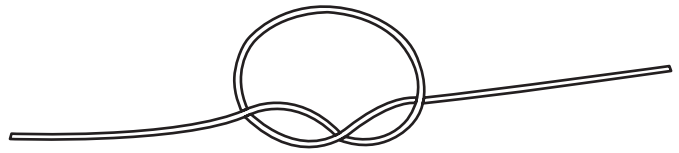
Useful for attaching lures. Will not slip. Allows lure to move freely

step 1



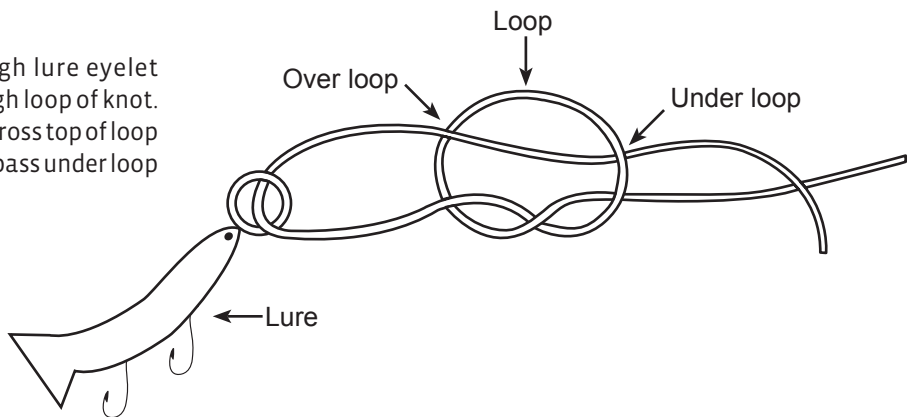
step 2

Tie a simple knot.



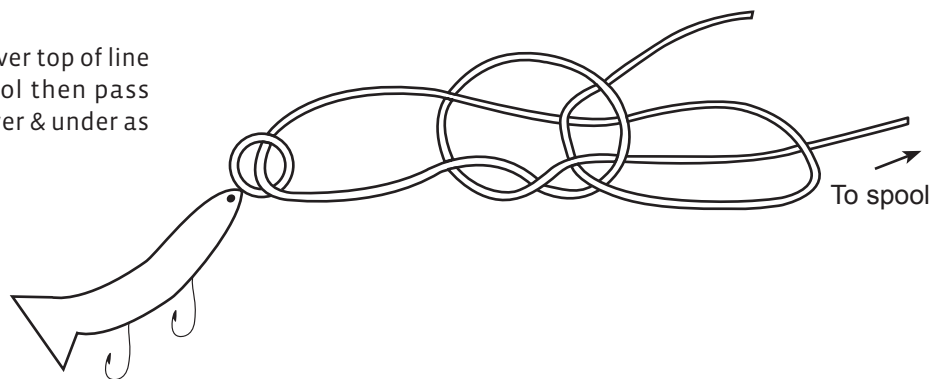
step 3

Run line through lure eyelet and back through loop of knot. Note that lines cross top of loop on one end and pass under loop on the other.



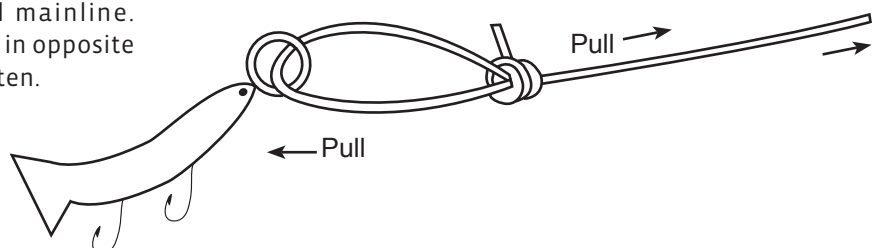
step 4

Pass line back over top of line running to spool then pass over & under, over & under as shown.



step 5

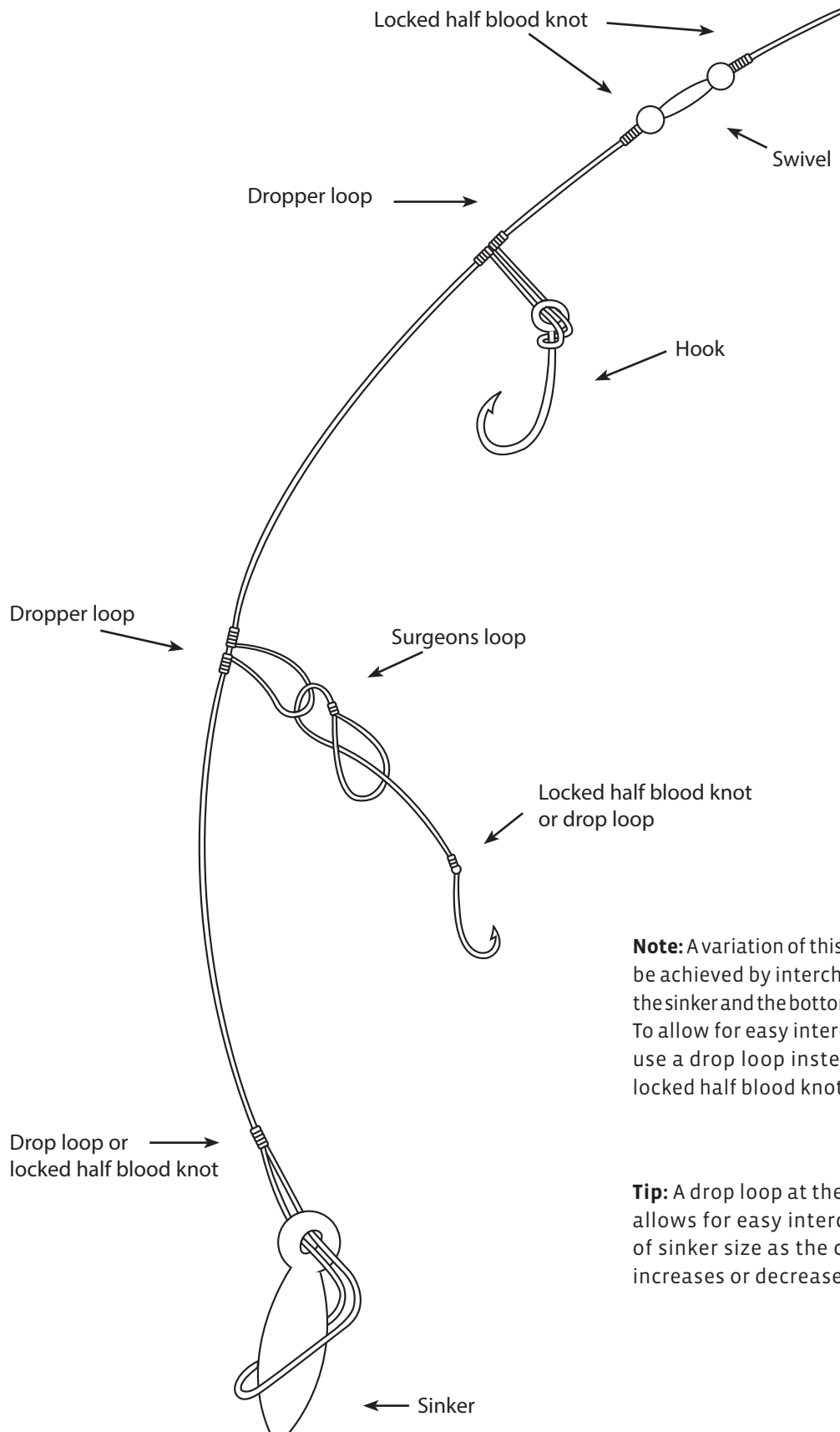
Grasp loop and mainline. Moisten and pull in opposite directions to fasten.



HOW TO TIE KNOTS

THE PATERNOSTER RIG

Example of fishing knots and their use in the paternoster rig.



Note: A variation of this rig can be achieved by interchanging the sinker and the bottom hook. To allow for easy interchange use a drop loop instead of a locked half blood knot where

Tip: A drop loop at the sinker allows for easy interchange of sinker size as the current increases or decreases.
